SUPPORTS FOR HOMELESS STUDENTS

You may qualify for certain rights and protections under the federal McKinney-Vento Act if you live in any of the following situations:

- In a shelter
- In a motel or campground, due to lack of alternative adequate accommodation
- In a car, park, abandoned building, or bus or train station
- Doubled up with other people due to loss of housing or economic hardship

Eligible students have the right to:

- Receive a free, appropriate public education
- Enroll in school immediately, even if lacking documents normally required for enrollment
- Enroll in the local school; or continue participating online at their school of origin (the school they attended when permanently housed or the school in which they were last enrolled), if that is their preference
 - *If the school district believes that the school selected is not in his/her/their best interest, then the district must provide the student with a written explanation of its position and inform the student of his/her/their right to appeal its decision.*
- Receive free breakfast/lunch by ESD Specialized Transportation if living outside of district
- Receive educational services comparable to those provided to other students, according to the students' needs.

SUPPORTS FOR FOSTER CARE STUDENTS

Guided by the Foster Care Education Program, Camas School District supports students in foster care by encouraging innovative practices that reduce educational disruptions, strengthen school stability, and improve academic performance.

Services: Free breakfast/lunch, coordination with DCYF, referrals to TreeHouse Educational Advocate, etc.
